1. What are cookies?

2. How and why we use cookies

We use cookies to gain a better understanding of how visitors use our website. Cookies help us tailor to your personal needs, and to improve usability.

To enable this, some cookies are applied when you enter the website. We keep all the information collected from cookies in a format that means we cannot identify individuals. Our cookies located on your computer do not retain your name or your IP address.

3. Storage and sharing of cookies

Our cookies don't collect or store your personal information (for example, your name or address) so this information can't be used to identify who you are. The cookies simply enable us to see behaviour on the website to help us improve your experience. We do not share this data with third parties.



If you share our content with friends through social networks – such as Facebook and Twitter – you may be sent cookies from these websites. We don't control the setting of these cookies, so please check third-party websites for more information about their cookies and how to manage them.

4. The type of cookies we use

In general, the cookies which are placed on a Wix website may be categorised as essential cookies. However, considering the platform provides the ability to add multiple components, codes, third-party applications. . .and so on, our website may include other types of cookies which might require specific settings.
